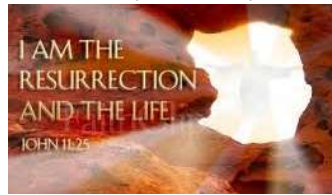

Parish Walks for Bicentenary

Last Wednesday 6 walkers started walking towards the Bicentenary of the Parish church. The walks will continue each week and last approximately forty minutes. The next walk takes place on **9th at 6pm** starting at the Luas Four Courts. *Why not join them to raise awareness about St. Michan's Parish while getting fit and losing weight?!*

Camino Walk to Santiago



A provisional booking has been made for September 2017. The plan is to set out on 7th September and fly to Vigo in Portugal. From there, the group will be taken by bus to Tui (approximately 20-minute journey). Walking an average of 12 miles each day, the group will make its way

along the coastal hills of Portugal and arrive in Santiago de Compostela on 13th September. There will be time to join fellow pilgrims at the daily Mass in Santiago and then an overnight stay before taking a coach back to Vigo for the return flight.

An information meeting is being organised with the **'Follow the Camino'** officials who will be able to clarify all our questions.

Holy Doors of Mercy

As the Jubilee Year of Mercy comes to an end, Holy Doors that have been opened will close around the world. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin will close the Holy Door of Mercy in St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral on Sunday before **11.00am Mass on Sunday 13th November.**

You are invited to cross the Holy Door at the Pro-Cathedral any day between now and November 13th. The door chosen by Archbishop leads into an area of the Pro-Cathedral that has two confessionals, and a statue memorial to Venerable Matt Talbot, whose life was healed from addiction when he encountered God's mercy. The Door also looks to the altar of St Laurence O'Toole, Patron of the Archdiocese and a man of mercy. Holy Doors of Mercy will also close on same date in Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Sean Mc Dermott Street, where the remains of Venerable Matt Talbot lie; the Church of St. Francis Xavier in Gardiner Street, which holds the Cross of Venerable John Sullivan; the Parish Church of Sts. Peter and Mary in Arklow; and also at the House of Mercy in Baggot Street, established in 1827 by Catherine Mc Auley, foundress of the Sisters of Mercy. *It was Pope Francis' desire that anyone passing through a "Door of Mercy" would experience the love of God who consoles, pardons and instils hope.*

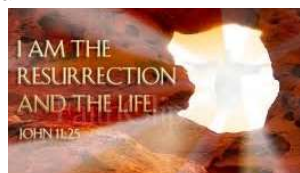
